Purpose

This document provides you with key information about this investment product. It is not marketing material. The information is required by law to help you understand the nature, risks, costs, potential gains and losses of this product and to help you compare it with other products.

Neuberger Berman Asset Management Ireland Limited ("**NBAMIL**"), the manufacturer of the Key Information Document ("**KID**") The Central Bank of Ireland (the "Central Bank") is responsible for supervising NBAMIL, which is part of the Neuberger Berman Group, in relation to this KID.

What is this product?

Type:

This product is a UCITS Fund.

Objectives:

The Fund aims to outperform the ICE BofA 0-1 Year AAA Euro Government Index (Total Return, EUR) (Benchmark) over a period of one year, through investing in a diversified mix of short-term Euro-denominated fixed and floating rate debt securities. There is no guarantee that the investment objective will be achieved and capital invested is at risk. The Fund will primarily be exposed to Euro-denominated debt securities and money market instruments which may be issued by governments, and their agencies or corporations across industry sectors from developed as well as emerging (less developed) market countries.

Under normal market conditions, the Sub-Investment Managers (or the Manager where applicable) will seek to invest at least two-thirds of the Fund's Net Asset Value "NAV) in a diversified portfolio of Euro-denominated debt securities of varying maturities. Up to a maximum of one-third of the Fund's NAV may be invested in money market instruments and debt securities issued by public or private issuers in non-Eurozone countries, including emerging market countries.

Securities may be rated investment grade or below (high yield) by a recognised rating agency. High yield bonds have a lower credit rating because they carry a higher risk of not being paid back and typically offer a higher income to make them attractive to investors.


The Fund is actively managed and it is not constrained by the Benchmark, which is used for performance comparison purposes only.

The Fund promotes environmental and social characteristics pursuant to Article 8 of SFDR.

As your shares are in Euro and the Fund is in Euros, currency exchange contracts are used to reduce the effect of changes in the currency exchange rate.

Income will be rolled up into the value of your investment.

What are the risks and what could I get in return? Risk Indicator

Term:

The Fund has no fixed maturity date, however it may be terminated in certain circumstances as described in the prospectus including if the Net Asset Value of the Fund does not exceed or falls below US\$75,000,000 (or such other amount as may be approved by the Directors).

The shares may be exchanged for shares in another sub-fund in accordance with the terms of the Prospectus. Charges may apply.

Shares in the Fund can be bought or sold on any day defined as a Business Day in Prospectus.

NBIF is established as umbrella fund with segregated liability between subfunds under Irish law.

Brown Brothers Harriman Trustee Services (Ireland) Limited (BBH) is appointed as the depositary of NBIF.

Intended retail investor:

This fund may be compatible with the needs of investors seeking a fund to deliver income or capital growth with an investment horizon of 1 year or more, as part of a diversified portfolio of investments.

This is a low to medium risk product and investors should consider this when deciding the mix of portfolio investments.

Investors who are unsure that they have the knowledge and experience to make informed investment decisions about this product or to construct a diversified portfolio should seek professional investment advice.

The product is unlikely to be compatible with the needs of those investors seeking a single investment, or who require preservation of capital or to achieve a specified return by a particular date.

We have classified this product as 2 out of 7, which is a low risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a low level and poor market conditions are very unlikely to impact the value of your investment. This product also carries market risk, operational risk, counterparty risk, currency risk, and other risks. Please refer to the "Risk Factor" section of the Prospectus. This product does not include any protection from future market performance so you could lose some or all of your investment.

Be aware of currency risk. You will receive payments in a different currency, so the final return you will get depend on the exchange rate between the two currencies. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above.

What happens if NBAMIL is unable to pay out?

We have assumed, in the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0 % annual return). For the other holding period, we have assumed the fund performs as shown in the moderate scenario and the investment is EUR 10,000.
